#### **Programme visibility Statistics**

- Total website hits: Sept 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017: 7,168 Sessions, 4,820 users
- Hits per day: 33.8
- Average time on website: 2mins 38 seconds
- viewing an average of 2.5 pages. 65.7% of them were new visitors.

#### 5a Programme visibility (CONT)

- Of note is a significant increase in engagement from Iran, with a 178% increase in traffic (145 visits up from 52) and an average time on-site of 11mins.
- We had 633 total downloads since Sept 1, 2016 (up from 91) of which 316 were unique files (including legal texts but excluding Spotlight newsletters which do not show up in this analysis).
- The top 5 topics for report downloads were: Task 17, Task 25, Task 24, EGRD and Task 13.
